



Exploring personality variables and belief in anomalous experiences

As part of an on-going research project, part-funded by the Bial Foundation (Ref: 48/20) Dr Elizabeth Roxburgh and Dr David Vernon from Canterbury Christ Church University (CCCU), and Dr Malcolm Schofield from Derby University are exploring the nature of extra sensory perception, or ESP. This is a fascinating and contentious subject with some people reporting experiences whilst others argue that such things are impossible. However, as scientists our job is to remain open minded yet critical – and examine the data.

This study is the first in a series of studies exploring unusual, anomalous or psychic experiences. It will examine possible links between aspects of individual personality, such as how sensitive a person you are, how much you use and rely on imagery and how open you are as a person, and your belief and experiences of unusual or anomalous phenomena. We will also ask you if you are willing to return and take part in one of our follow-up studies. To compensate you for your time in completing this first study we will enter you into a prize draw which offers a first prize of a £100 shopping voucher, two second prizes of £50 vouchers and ten runner up prizes of £10 vouchers.
